Thy rear I Am,

With reference to our letter (1014/60) of April 26 about the recent arrests of foreigners and Egyptians on the grounds of alleged spying for Israel, you may be interested in the following.

- 2. The Netherlands Ambassador told me on May 2nd that he had seen his compatriot Meewis Goudswaard and he was pretty sure that he was guilty. He did not state, however, whether all the accusations against Goudswaard were true, or whether he was the master spy that he has been alleged to be. The Ambassador added that Israeli espionage methods seemed to be pretty inefficient. He also said that until the announcements had been made Goudswaard's treatment by the police had been extremely good.
- 3. The Ambassador went on to say that he was quite satisfied there would be no trouble from the Dutch unions over a boycott of U.A.R. ships. They would only have to be asked whether they wished to put a rope around the neck of their compatriot.
- 4. When I saw the Italian Counsellor last night I asked him about the Italians involved in the spy trials. I said I understood the Dutchman was thought to be guilty. Was this the case with the Italians too? Senor Orlandi said the Dutchman had confessed and he had denounced a number of the other people involved. He was not therefore very popular. As for one of the Italians he did not specify which it appears that he was in Italy when he received a telegram from Cairo asking him to return to give the department for which he formerly worked some advice. The telegram said his ticket would be available at the Misrair office and he would not need a visa. The man duly picked up his ticket and was arrested on arrival in Cairo.
- 5. This would hardly seem to indicate a guilty conscience. Moreover, the man had been a fascist and had supported the Germans after Mussolini's fall. At the end of the War he had escaped to Egypt. It seemed more likely, therefore, that he would be anti-rather than pro-Jewish. Senor Orlandi thought, however, that he might have agreed to provide information about Russian technicians out of hatred of communism.

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6. The German Embassy, on the other hand, have told us that they do not think that Dr. Fritz Katz is guilty. Katz, a gew who is said to have been in Egypt since about 1932, is a bon viveur and was often to be seen, we are told, in Cairo and Alexandria society. Two things tell against him. First, he has undoubtedly been in touch with Israel, for he has a sister there whom he has been in the habit of meeting in Europe most summers. Secondly, he does not deny that when in Zurich he saw a person named Glaser, or something such, whom the Egyptian Intelligence think is an Israeli "spy-master", and put him in touch with Rizk, one of the Egyptian accused. Katz maintains, however, that as far as he was concerned this was a simple business introduction; and the German Embassy say that one of the judges has given them some reason to hope that the charges against Katz may not be pressed.

My Society has been approached by an organisation calling itself The Egyptian Political Prisoners Defence Committee asking us to send an observer to trials of political prisoners, which are being held in Egypt, the most recent being at Alexandria on 17th December, in camera before General Hilal Abdallah Hilal's State Security Tribunal.

Unfortunately, we are not properly informed about this organisation, or about the trials.

Our informants allege some breaches of procedure of the minimum requirements of a fair trial. We are always anxious to help or do anything we can to secure a fair trial wherever this may be needed. We would welcome information which you could give us to assist us in deciding what action, if any, we should take.

Parliamentary Question

The Alan Thompson: To ask the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, if he will instruct the United Kingdom delegate on the Peace Observation Commission of the United Nations to inquire about the extent to which the propaganda activities of ex-Nazis now residing in Egypt are contributing to international tension.

Dr. Thempson has obviously introduced mention of the Peace Observation Commission merely in order to get his question on to the Order Paper. United Nations Department would not expect him to concentrate on the activities (or rather inactivity) of the Commission on any Supplementary Questions.

- 2. The Peace Observation Commission was established by the General Assembly in 1950 as part of the machinery which is known generally as "Uniting for Peace". There are 14 members (including the 5 permanent members of the Security Council). Briefly, the Commission
- (a) may be used by the General Assembly
 (or the Interim Committee when the
 Assembly is not in session) provided
 that the Security Council is not acting
 in the matter; it may also be used by
 the Security Council itself;
- (b) will go to a country only on that country's invitation or with its permission;
- (c) can appoint subsidiary bodies and observers.

It is not therefore possible for H.M.G. to instruct the U.K. Representative on the Commission to raise a matter; such an initiative would have to be taken at a meeting of the Security Council or by calling a session of the General Assembly. Moreover, the Commission has no power to investigate on the ground without the consent or permission of the Government of the U.A.R.

J. Dr. Thompson is clearly interested in the recent anti-Semitic campaign, to which he insinuates that ex-Mazis in Egypt have contributed. There are in fact some former Nazis in Egypt, who are doubtless useful to the Egyptians in e.g. military and propaganda capacities, but there is no evidence that they indulge in any significant political activity or that they have been active in the recent outbursts of anti-Semitiam. We should not however go into this in our answer, since it would be construed as interference in the affairs of the U.A.R.



Dear Department,

Would you please refer to paragraph 5 of Cairo telegram No. 49 Saving about the Israeli spy ring operating in the United Arab Republic. (This is, incidentally, the same affair which we reported in Cairo telegram No. 482 of November 21, 1959). \ vR1074| 33^[59]

- The following is a summary of the details as revealed by the press since April 21.
- Ten United Arab Republic nationals and six foreigners have been arrested. The United Arab Republic nationals include mechanics in the United Arab Republic Air Force, an ex-pilot of Misrair and a lawyer. The foreigners consist of a Dutchman, Meewis Goudswaard, a German, Dr. Katz, two Italians (the Manager of a hotel in Alexandria and one other), and two Greeks (a waiter in one of Cairo's leading restaurants and a shop assistant). Goudswaard is a Dutch businessman who has lived in Alexandria and Cairo on and off for some years. Dr. Katz is the head surgeon at an Alexandria hospital. He is said to be a Jew.
- 4. According to the press the United Arab Republic Intelligence Services have been on the track of this spy ring for three years; arrests began late last year and the State Security Prosecution authorities have just completed a six months investigation of the case. The Intelligence Services are said to have penetrated the spy ring and to have passed false information through it to the Israeli authorities.
- Houses and effices of the accused have been raided and equipment such as invisible ink, cameras, developing equipment, and wireless transmitters and receivers have been seized.
- The accused are alleged to have been in contact with Israeli agents in Europe particularly in Rome and Geneva and to have been supplying information about the political and economic situation in the United Arab Republic, United Arab Republic relations with Russia and details of port installations, naval movements, airports, ammunition dumps and factories, and general military intelligence. The trial is due to begin on May 7 and the prosecution has demanded the death penalty for nine of the accused, including the Dutchman, the two Italians and the two Greeks. A confused story has also emerged that the Greek waiter was under orders to try to poison President Nasser.
