Nasser's outburst against Aden in his big speech this week, including the comments about its forthcoming liberation from the British, made me look again at the reports from UKHIS New York on the debate on Colonialism.

- 2. I see that in Plenary No. 57 (UKMIS New York No. 251 of December 5) the U.A.C. Delegate, Riad, made some remarks about Oman where he alleged the people "had been bombarded by the British R.A.F. and the perceful population was subjected to all sorts of terror". As in the case of Nasser's attack on us in Aden, I am not clear what our policy is as regards replying: as you know, we here have the impression that the Foreign Office is too ready to turn the other cheek and keep quiet. But also, as you know, we have produced evidence from here recently of the U.A.A. Force using napalm against Yemeni tribesmen. " I should have thou ht that if we are accused of bombarding peaceful Omanis it would be reasonable to comment that we have never dropped napalm on defenceless villagers as the Egyptians do. The napalm story has also been authenticated by Colonel Maclean in his travels on the Royalist side.
- Probably it is too late to hit back with napalm in the United Nations. But other occasions may arise.
- There is also incidentally a story running round the Colony that the Egyptians have been dropping explosive cigarettes on the Royalist side of the line, and there is said to be a casualty in a local hospital here who tried to light one of these. But the evidence is not yet clear, though the B.B.C. correspondent is trying to track it down.
