As I reported in mytel 617, ² I spoke to Minister Foreign Affairs last Saturday about Tel Aviv's 398. ³ I spoke again to him this morning along lines Deptel 705. ⁴ Fawzi said that in meantime he had spoken to Prime Minister, Minister Interior, etc. They all agree that every effort should be made to prevent incidents in Gaza, area. On one hand they do not deny that there are infiltrations from Gaza side. On other hand they forcefully insist that Israelis are exaggerating their number and importance.

They insist also that for some time they have been taking appropriate measures to control infiltrations. They will redouble their efforts in that direction. They definitely do not want trouble with Israel.

In this connection GOE has always indicated willingness enter into cooperative control arrangements between local police commanders. However, when General Burns recently attempted to call meeting for this purpose, Israelis indicated they were not ready to hold such discussions now (see Embdesps 858, November 5 and 886, November 10). ⁸
